Universities Addressing Florida's Energy Needs

- Analysis sample of 105 Florida Housing Finance Corporation (FHFC) properties with 14,580 units
 - 48 properties (6,285 units) in Jacksonville (JEA)
 - 47 properties (7,191 units) in Orlando (OUC)
 - 10 properties (1,104 units) in Gainesville (GRU)
- Three years of electricity consumption data:
 2010-2012
- Aggregate and stratified by unit- and householdlevel characteristics
- Estimated monthly bills using rate structures






Energy Consumption In FHFC's Multifamily Housing Portfolio
